Dean's Message

N ow that summer is about to come to an end, I am reflecting on the special moments during the last two months: As we had already done last year, we again refrained from taking flights and instead traveled by car with friends to exceptionally beautiful areas and parks, like Canyonlands, Arches and Capitol Reef National Parks in Utah, and backpacked for four days in Emigrant Wilderness in California.

During our first day in the Emigrant Wilderness, a 6.1 earthquake hit, the epicenter of which was close to where we were backpacking. It was a unique experience to encounter an earthquake high up in the mountains. In our case, it was accompanied by a massive rockslide. But without any phone reception, the most unusual aspect was not knowing anything specific about the earthquake: Where was the epicenter, and what was the magnitude? How extensive was the damage, and did it occur in, or reach, the Bay Area? Was the Bay Bridge still standing? The earthquake we experienced in the wilderness felt like a good analogy of what we are going through during this current phase of the pandemic, the spread of the delta variant. We do not know how hard the delta variant will hit us, and we do not know when it will end nor whether another variant will follow. As with the wilderness experience where we just continued our plan and kept on

Bay Area Student Wins International Prize

B ay Area native Daniel Chang, student of Simon Berry, has won an international prize.



The prize-winners of the 31st St Albans International Organ Competition have been announced at a screening at St Albans Cathedral on Friday 16 July, which was also streamed live on the Organ Festival's website.

An exceptionally large field participated in the Preliminary Recorded Round, which was open to organists of all nationalities born after 17 July 1988. The judges selected twelve performers to take part in the online competition:
